FALL 2023 ENROLLMENT HIGHLIGHTS



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FALL 2023 OFFICIAL ENROLLMENT OVERVIEW

In the fall of 2023, 17,780 students generated 159,621 bill hours, or 5,320.7 FTEs.

- 3,566 or 20.0% are first-time-ever-in-college (FTEIC) students
- 986 or 5.5% transferred from other colleges
- 11,263 or 63.3% are returning students
- 1,965 or 11.1% are concurrently enrolled in high school
- Compared to fall 2022, student enrollment increased by +3.8% with 643 more students, and credit hours rose by +6.2%, reflecting an increase of 9,267 bill hours.

Demographic Highlights

- Students are younger. The average age is 23.1, down from 23.9 in fall 2022.
- 53.4% are female; 46.3% are male
- White students continued to decrease (19.0%), while Hispanic students increased to 29.0% as the largest race/ethnic group.

Highlights of Selective Student Groups

- First-time-ever-in-college (FTEIC) enrollment increased by 9.4%, with 306 more students.
- 2,393, or 19.9%, recent MCPS high school graduates enrolled at the College, marking a 10.8% increase compared to fall 2022, or 233 more MCPS graduates.
- F-1 Visa student enrollment increased by 32.2%, or 111 more students
- 65.1% of Fall 2022 FTEIC students re-enrolled in Fall 2023

Enrollment Pattern Highlights

- 65.6% attend part-time; 34.4% attend full-time
- 39.6% enrolled in at least one distance learning course
- Average credit load per student is 9.0, an increase of 0.2 from Fall 2022.

The top five high schools account for 31.1% of the total MCPS recent high school graduates (2,393) enrolled at Montgomery College this Fall.

Among the 26 Montgomery County public high schools, Watkins Mill High School has the top high school graduates' draw rate of 32.8% for Montgomery College, followed by Magruder High School (29.9%) and Wheaton High School (29.8%).


