MCYPA members sat down with Dave Sears, Senior Vice President for Advancement and Community Engagement, on November 11, 2014.

Sears began the informal conversation by introducing himself to the group and providing a brief overview of the departments that fall under the Advancement and Community Engagement umbrella: Creative Services, Development, Foundation, Grants, Marketing, Media Relations, MCTV, Photography, Special Events, and the Alumni Association.

Following Sears's self-introduction, a Q&A began with him answering a series of questions meant to get to the core of the accumulated lessons he had learned on his professional journey. Sears shared knowledge gained from mistakes, mentors, and his aspirations.

One of the most valuable pieces of advice he shared was the term QTIP (Quit Taking It Personally). He said this recently acquired wisdom shared with him at a conference was one of the pieces of advice he wishes he had known earlier in his career.

After answering questions, Sears asked some questions of his own, resulting in an engaging and candid conversation about how young professionals at the College can become more involved in College initiatives and grow professionally.
