Student Employment Service (SES) Report of Remote Service from July 1st, 2020 to September 30th, 2020

Students Employment Services (SES) provided individual assistance and group workshops to students through a variety of online platforms. SES has collaborated with other departments and employers to facilitate pre-employment skills training and job/internship opportunities for students. Some of the highlights for this quarter include; (3) workshops related to applying for Federal jobs/internships held on Sept 17th & 18th attended by 499 students. A Federal Job Fair on September 25th that included 50 Federal agencies and attended by 105 students. A job search workshop for F-1 students attended by 22 students, (2) Workforce Recruitment Program orientations related to Federal internship opportunities for DSS students attended by 11 students, A job search workshop provided to Certified Phlebotomy Technician students and attended by 18 students. In addition, to workshops and large events, the SES team provided individual assistance to 479 students and 97 new employers during the quarter.
