David Ross is an artist and educator working in the field of STEAM. After obtaining his M.F.A. from American University, Ross began mentoring youth in art and technology at the Hirshhorn's makerspace, ARTLAB+. He built similar programming at the U.S. Embassy in Korea, where he discovered the prevalent toy culture he incorporated into his practice. Ross creates "Blanks," a term coined in the designer toy movement for physical characters stripped down to their most basic elements. He has worked in makerspaces at both public and university libraries, and is currently at the Corcoran's Fablab.
