The essay may address questions such as,

- O Why is a humanities approach necessary to understanding others?
- What do you see as the importance of global studies and humanistic approaches to global issues?
- o What do you see as your potential role in terms of work to impact global contexts in the future?
- o What historical figure ignites your interests in becoming an active global citizen?
