Sergio Troncoso will be reading from and discussing his new collection of linked short stories on immigration, *A Peculiar Kind of Immigrant's Son* (Cinco Puntos Press), which Junot Díaz praised as a "masterwork." The son of Mexican immigrants, Troncoso explores immigrants finding their home beyond the United States-Mexico border, trying to fit in, and being outsiders as present struggles and memories of the past pull them in different directions.

Troncoso is the author of numerous books and essays including *This Wicked Patch of Dust*, *Crossing Borders: Personal Essays*, *The Nature of Truth* and *The Last Tortilla and Other Stories*.
