You can

- Work at the Library of Congress, the Smithsonian, or the Holocaust Museum for a semester;
- Interact with and support professionals and scholars in the workplace;
- Participate in a three-credit honors class working with an MC mentor focused on an independent study project of your choice;
- AND
- Receive a \$1600 scholarship.

The Paul Peck Humanities Institute's academic internship will

- Enhance your resume as you prepare to transfer to a 4-year school,
- Train you for the professional workforce,
- Help you attain a better job on graduation,
- Help you get into graduate school.

FAQs

Many 4-year schools expect their students to have at least two academic internships before they graduate.

Application requirements

- Students must meet the following requirements to qualify for this honors program:
- be at least 16 years old at the time the internship commences;
- have completed 15 credit hours of coursework at MC;
- be currently enrolled and have satisfied all fiduciary obligations to the school to date;
- have earned a 3.4 overall grade point average;
- be matriculated for a degree;
- have completed (or be enrolled in at the time of application) ENGL102
 - or EN103. This course must be completed prior to commencement of internship, with at least a grade of B.



Internship class requirements

- Work at your institution with your supervisor for 240 hours during the semester (16 hours a week for 15 weeks of semester/ summer = 20 hours a week for 12 weeks). This is considered classroom time.
- Work with an MC mentor for your 3 credits of independent study (HNOR 275).
- requires biweekly meeting with college mentor,
- academic journaling, a research paper/project,
- presentation of the project and creation of an
- annotated bibliography.
