

Supply List—Lauren Kingsland Quilting for Beginners LLI 223

We will be hand stitching a small quilt by piecing a variety of traditional blocks and assembling them into a top. Borders, quilting and binding the edges will complete the project. Through this small piece we will learn the skills used to make larger quilts.

Tools to bring: (Bring what you have to the first class. You can shop later)

- 18" acrylic ruler 3" or wider
- Rotary cutter
- Cutting mat 12 x 18 or larger
- Fabric scissors
- Paper scissors for plastic/paper
- Thread snips
- Needle threader
- *Needles John James betweens (8, 9, 10)
- Straight pins
- Thimble
- *1 sheet template plastic
- *1 sheet fine sandpaper
- Marking pencils yellow or silver colored; .5 mm mechanical pencil

For the first class you need:

- 1 spool of high quality cotton thread in neutral tan or grey
- Scissors, pins, needles, thimble.

Materials for subsequent classes:

- 5 fat quarters of fabric in a contrasting assortment. A fat quarter measures 18"x 20" and is readily available precut at fabric stores. *You may add additional fabrics during the class as the project takes shape.
- *Batting
- Additional backing or binding fabrics.

Instructor will provide at no additional cost:

- Sandpaper folder
- Batting
- All patterns, handouts and templates
